### BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONAL PREMISES (REGISTRATION)

A Law to make Provision for the Registration of Business and Professional Premises and for other Matters Incidental Thereto or Connected Therewith.

[15th November, 1984]

- 1. This Law may be cited as the Business and Professional Short title. Premises (Registration) Law.
- 2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires: "Business" has the meaning assigned to it in the Business Premises (Rent Control) Law:

Interpretation. Cap 23.

- "Commissioner" means the State Commissioner responsible for Commerce and Industries;
- "Court" includes the High Court or a Magistrate's Court but does not include a customary court:
- "functions" includes powers and duties;
- "Ministry" means the State Ministry of Commerce and Industries:
- "the Permanent Secretary means the Permanent Secretary of the State's Ministry of Commerce and Industries;
- "Premises" means any house or building or any part thereof together with its grounds or other appurtenances and any land without any building thereon used for the purposes of any business or profession carried on by the proprietor or practitioner;

"Proprietor" includes a company duly registered under the LFN 1990 provisions of the Companies and firm, association or part- Cap 59 nership of any number of persons.

3. (1) No person shall carry on any business unless the busi- Registration ness or professional premises has been duly registered by the Ministry.

and professional premises.

(2) Application for the registration of any business or professional premises shall be made to the Permanent Secretary in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall be accompanied with a receipt for the appropriate sum specified in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto issued by the nearest State Government Treasury and the applicant's tax clearance certificate for the last three years.

(4) Subject to the provisions of section 5 of this Law, the registration of a premises shall be renewed annually upon the production of a receipt for the sum specified in the Third column of the Second Schedule hereto issued by the nearest State Government Treasury and the applicant's tax clearance certificate for the last three years.

Inspection of premises.

4. It shall be lawful for the Permanent Secretary or any officer authorised by him in writing to enter any building or premises being used as business or professional premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of inspection of such building or premises in order to ascertain compliance with the provisions of this Law.

"Power to seal off a business or professional premises.

4a (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Law, it shall be lawful for the Permanent Secretary or any officer authorised by him in writing, with the assistance of the Commissioner of Police of the State or his representative, to seal off any business or professional premises whose proprietor evades or refuses to pay the appropriate registration fee.

(2) It shall be unlawful for the proprietor, his servant or agent to transact any business or remove the seal until the appropriate registration fee is paid or the seal is removed by the Permanent Secretary or any officer authorised by him".

Power to suspend or cancel registration.

5. Where it appears to the Permanent Secretary or any officer authorised by him in writing, that the provisions of this Law are not being complied with, he may by order in writing addressed to the proprietor or to the person for the time being in charge or appearing to be in charge thereof suspend or cancel the registration of such premises.

Appeal.

- 6. (1) Any proprietor aggrieved;
- (a) by the refusal of the Permanent Secretary to grant or renew a certificate of registration, or

(b) by the suspension or cancellation by the Permanent Secretary or revenue agent or consultant appointed by the Commissioner under section 12 of this Law of a certificate of registration, may within thirty days appeal to the Governor against such refusal, suspension or cancellation.

8. (1) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this General Law or who obstructs or in any way hinders or prevents or Secretary or one of the provisions of this Penalty Oys the Permanent Secretary or any officer authorised by him 1996 NO. 11 in writing or a revenue agent or consultant appointed by the Commissioner under Section 12 of this Law in the discharge of his duties under this Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of \$\frac{1}{2000}\$ for an individual and ₹5,000 for a corporate body or six months imprisonment or to both fine and imprisonment.

(2) Any person who defaults in the payment of registration OYS or renewal fees under this Law, shall in addition to the fine or imprisonment imposed under sub-section I of this Section be liable to pay the appropriate registration or renewal fees for the year and twenty one percent of such fees for each year of default.

9. The provisions of this Law shall apply to any premises Registration which have been in existence prior to the coming into force of business or this law and the proprietor of such premises shall apply for professional registration thereof within a period of six months from the premises. coming into Operation of this Law

10. The Commissioner may delegate to the Permanent Delegation of Secretary all or any of the powers conferred on the powers Commissioner by this Law subject to such restrictions, conditions and qualifications, not being inconsistent with the provisions or intendment of this Law as the Commissioner may specify.

11. The Commissioner may, whenever he considers it fit so to Power to do, make regulations in respect of the establishment and inspections. tion of any premises and generally for the carrying into effect the purpose of this Law and, without prejudice to the generality of the power so conferred, in particular for:
